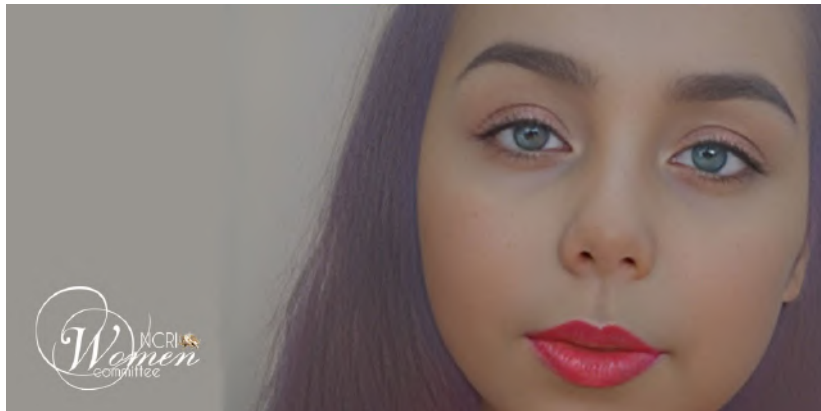

Zahra Hatami, an 8th grader, committed suicide on Sunday, October 1, 2023, after school authorities expelled her from school for wearing nail polish.

Zahra Hatami was studying at Narjes High School in Vahidieh, **Shahriar**, one of Tehran's suburbs. She was expelled from school for three days for wearing nail polish.

Zahra Hatami was afraid of going home to tell her father. Some reports indicate that she was afraid of being forcibly married after being expelled from school. So, she jumped off the roof of a half-built building near the school.
